It makes us all proud to see that you have been showing your colours in all the fields you worked in ever since you became a coloursman at St. John's in both Cricket and Athletics.

Our Chief Guest has all the required ingredients for success. He is good in English, is a sportsman, and knows accountancy, law and theology. He is a Chartered Global Management Accountant who is a Fellow of the Chartered Institute of Management Accountants, United Kingdom. It might surprise you all that he is a Doctor of Mission at St. Andrew's Theological University of India and also an Attorney-At-Law of the Supreme Court of Sri Lanka.

Equipped with good qualifications, leadership skills and other soft skills, he took up many responsibilities in the corporate world. He was:

- Director and Chairman of United Mission to Nepal, Kathmandu
- Member of the Sri Lankan Boards of Back to the Bible Broadcast, Campus Crusade for Christ, Healthcare Christian Fellowship, Lanka Bible College, Global Impact, and Vision Fund Lanka
- Bible teacher and lecturer in Business and Company Law for 34 years
- Member of the International Faculty of Haggai Institute, Hawaii, United States of America

Our Chief Guest has two traits that will definitely be of interest to students like you. He is a prolific writer and an excellent actor. He has, despite his very busy schedule, authored two books – "Daniel Part I – Daniel Outside His Comfort Zone" and "Introduction to Law Relating to Business." He has also acted in two movies – "A Common Man" and "Parachute" - to be released soon.

Common Man, a 2013 American-Sri Lankan thriller film, won Best Picture, Best Director and Best Actor awards at the Madrid International Film Festival and Bronze Medal in the Feature Films category at the New York Festivals' International Television and Film Awards.

Higher Education

As we celebrate the 195th anniversary of our College, we have taken a step to initiate a Higher Education Programme.

We created the Bursary system because we didn't want a student studying at St. John's to discontinue his studies due to financial constraints. Similarly, we have planned to create a Higher Education Scholarship Fund to ensure that no eligible student forgoes an opportunity to pursue his tertiary education due to his monetary limitations. You will agree that money should not stand in the way of one's education.

We wish to create funds of Rupees 5 million for each of twelve different areas of study (given hereunder). The interest we receive from the scholarship fund will produce a graduate every year.

The purposes are to:

- Take St. John's College to the next level – to upgrade it to the university level.
- Produce professional tutorial staff for St. John's.
- Motivate the faculty members to get their first degree / post graduate studies / Masters / Ph.D.
- Have a pool of staff who are good in their subject area and English. Students who come back from foreign universities will also have had a lot of exposure abroad. They can bring back to St. John's College new up-to-date teaching learning methodologies based on educational psychologists' current discoveries.
