PRINCIPAL'S PRIZE DAY REPORT

Chief Guest, Rt.Rev.W.W.M.W.D.Keerthisiri Fernando, Chairperson of the CMS Governing Body, Mrs. Thanja Peiris, Members of the Governing Body, President, OBA Jaffna, Dr.U.Mayoorathan, Brother Clergy, Heads of Institutions and Schools, Distinguished Guests, Old Boys, Parents and Well-wishers,

St. John's extends to you all a warm and cordial welcome to its Annual Prize Day Celebrations. The presence of parents, Old Boys and well-wishers in large number encourages us this morning. We are confident that your interest in our school will remain deep and unfailing.

We are greatly honoured to have an eminent person at our Prizing Giving today. Thank you very much for accepting our invitation. We warmly welcome you, Bishop Keerthi to the Annual Prize Day celebrations.

Our Chief Guest, Bishop Keerthisiri Fernando, an old boy of Prince of Wales College, Moratuwa has made his Alma Mater proud by climbing up the ladder to become the Bishop of Kurunagala. His ecclesiastical ascent started in 1989 when he was made Deacon and shortly afterwards, an ordained priest. Coincidentally, his first appointment as Deacon was in Badulla in 1989 where my father served as Vicar. I was in the Youth Fellowship under Father Keerthi and he encouraged me to preach my first sermon in the Church.

Bishop Keerthi has been a Curate, Vicar, Youth Chaplain, Member of the Ministerial Advisory Committee of the Diocese of Colombo, worked for the Whitstable Team Ministry in the Diocese of Canterbury, UK, where he was licensed to officiate, became Director – Fulltime Lay Workers of the Diocese of Colombo, was licensed to officiate in the Diocese of Kurunagala, was appointed the Sri Lankan representative of NIFCON (Network for Inter Faith Concerns), was engaged in pastoral ministry in numerous parishes/institutions in Sri Lanka. He served as Chairperson of Interfaith Desk of the Diocese of Colombo and the Chair of the Confederation of Churches – Moratuwa area deanery. He was an Examining Chaplain of the Diocese of Colombo. He has served as Area Dean of Moratuwa and environs and was the Archdeacon of Nuwara Eliya – Diocese of Colombo before his episcopal ordination in 2018.

In addition to his many involvements in the Christian ministry, he has been working with people of sister faiths and no faith, promoting xenophilia instead of xenophobia. As a member of the "Clergy Choir" of the Diocese of Colombo, he has been promoting Gospel values. His interest in music and singing has promoted discipleship among various people to date.

During his stint in the UK from 2001 to 2005, he organised several multi-cultural and interreligious programmes in numerous schools and charity organisations. While in the UK, he was invited by the Archbishop of Canterbury to deliver a speech on 'Worldwide Links of the Diocese of Canterbury.' Back home, his contribution to the Theological College of Lanka, Pilimatalawa was immense. He served as a Lecturer and I am one of his students at TCL. He was in charge of the publication of textbooks. He also served as Director of Field Education, Postgraduate Dean and even Acting Principal, which role he is doubling at this very moment as well. It must be mentioned at this juncture that our Chief Guest rendered his services as the Acting Principal of the School for the Deaf in Ratmalana and also at St. Thomas' College, Bandarawela.

Also worthy of mention is his role as an Advisor for Day School Text books on Christianity for the Department of Education, Sri Lanka. He is also the Patron and founder member of YMCA Matara.

His vision is to foster peace and harmony among various ethnic and religious groups through his academic, pastoral and administrative strengths, experiences and abilities to create a better future for the citizens of the world.

Our Chief Guest holds a double Master of Philosophy (MPhil) in Theology & Sociology related fields. He also holds Bachelor of Theology and Bachelor of Divinity Degrees. As if this was not enough, he also holds qualifications in Engineering from an examinations body in the UK.

Our distinguished guest is the author of more than 8 books and has presented a few seminar papers on identities of Sinhala Buddhists and Christians. He has also taken part in many radio and television discussions on various subjects ranging from religions to immigrants to education. His well-researched articles have appeared in many newspapers, magazines, journals and e-journals. One has to just Google his name to see what a man of renown he is. The internet is full of articles by him. An academic of his calibre is rare and extremely hard to find. Students, I encourage you to take our Chief Guest as your role model.

His zeal for learning and his passion for imparting his knowledge to the others have made him to reach great heights. Children, right on stage, we see an example of what learning and sharing knowledge can do to a person. I would advise you to follow his footsteps. There is a saying in English - reach for the stars; if you fall short, you can still land on the moon. Try to emulate our Chief Guest. Even if you fall short, you will still end up being a respected and an honourable person.

- On 1st December 2018, the College held its first Graduation Day where 100% of the students (25 students) who followed Building Career Skills at St John's College Continuing Education were awarded certificates for the successful completion of their course of study. The Guest of Honour at the function was Mr. Ratnasingam Mathan, Assistant Director (NVQ), Tertiary & Vocational Education Commission. Mr. Christie A Pararajasingam coordinated the courses under St. John's College Continuing Education.
- Plans to commence Developing Career Skills (NVQ2), Advancing Career Skills (NVQ4), Diploma in English and Education (NVQ5) & Higher National Diploma in English and Education (NVQ6) came to a standstill after the Tertiary & Vocational Education Commission's decision to temporary stop English related courses and focus more on trade courses.
- An application for the renewal of registration of the Centre was made. The Tertiary and Vocational Education Commission has renewed the registration up to 13.12.2020.
- After a careful analysis of the courses available, it was decided to start Pre School Teacher course (NVQ3) in the English Medium. The response to a paper advertisement calling for interested students to enrol and another calling for qualified teachers to apply for the post of a lecturer, was minimal. The course had to be discontinued due to its unpopularity in the North.
- The Tertiary & Vocational Education Commission has plans to hold special NVQ RPPL Assessments. RPL (Recognition of prior learning) is an assessment process that assesses the persons' competencies acquired through informal, non-institutional learning to determine the extent to which that person has achieved the required competencies as set out in the relevant National Skills Standard leading to a qualification of the NVQ framework. Six of our staff who studied 'Introduction to Working in an Office' have applied.

The Celebration of Thanksgiving commemorating the 195th Anniversary of the College and the Bicentennial of the Arrival of the Founder, the Rev. Joseph Knight to Sri Lanka was held on 29th June 2018. The open-air function was held at the Karunyan Stand and was webcast for all interested stakeholders to see.

The Bishop of Colombo - the Rt. Rev. Dhiloraj R. Canagasabey, Archdeacon of Jaffna and Manager of the College and Chairperson of the CMS Governing Body - Mrs.Thanja Peiris attended. The Guard of Honour and members of the Land/Sea and Air Scouts paid a fitting welcome to the guests and the College Band led the visitors from the college main gate to the venue at five o'clock in the evening.

The Choir comprising of students from Grade four to Advanced Level, specially trained for this special occasion sang the College Hymn – the first item in the agenda.

The Archdeacon of Jaffna led the audience in the Opening Prayer.

The Welcome Speech was delivered by the Senior Prefect, R.Abinayan. 'I look ahead into the future – to a time when we will be celebrating the College's bicentennial in 2023 – in just five years from today. The community of St. John's, at the helm of which is our Principal and Mr.Bernard Sinniah, Global Chairman of Vision 2023, have various projects planned to make St. John's from being one of the best schools in the North to be the best in the island. We now have a basketball court and a tennis court that is one of the best at national level. The Technology Block is the only four storey Technology building at school level in the island. We are making milestones! With this momentum, you and I, together, can make our alma mater the best!' was the concluding statement of the Senior Prefect.

Next the Chairperson of the CMS Governing Body. Mrs.Thanja Peiris, conveyed her greetings. She talked about the past, present and future of the College and expressed her satisfaction at its growth over the years, in spite of the many challenges and obstacles faced.

Mr. T.Vipulanandamoorthy sang a Christian Song in Tamil, in praise of the Creator of the Universe. After the song, the Vice Principal, Mr.A.H.Gnanarajan talked about how St. John's came to be and about its achievements during the hundred-year period from 1823 to 1922.

Next was an Eastern Orchestra. Following the Orchestra, the Vice Principal, Mr.V.S.B.Thuseetharan gave the history of the College from 1823 to the present.

After a group of girls from Chundikuli Girls' College performed a dance, a Tamil Hymn by the Choristers followed.

Mementos were given by the Principal to the special invitees, people in charge of the Choir and to the outsiders who provided entertaining programmes.

The Tamil Hymn 'Thuthy Geetham' played to the accompaniment of eastern and western instruments was followed by 'The Lord of Years.'

The sermon by the Bishop of Colombo, the Rt. Revd. Dhiloraj Canagasabey, was based on patience and perseverance in the faith of Christ. He told the audience to live according to His word for His will to be done in their lives.

At the Celebration of Thanksgiving, Rs. 26,251/= was received as collection towards the Higher Education Scholarship Fund to ensure that no eligible student forgoes an opportunity to pursue his tertiary education due to his monetary limitations. The College wishes to create funds of Rupees 5 million for each of twelve different areas of study identified. The interest the College hopes to receive from the scholarship fund, is hoped, will produce a graduate every year.

'On Eagles' Wings' by the College Choir and the College Song brought the function to an end.

PROJECTS

1. 50m SWIMMING POOL PROJECT

The College couldn't proceed with the 50m Swimming Pool Project because the expectations of Dr.Jeyendran Gunasegaram, the donor, from the community of St. John's College to raise funds to match his contribution, did not materialise.

2. MECHANIZED RAIN GUN IRRIGATION SYSTEM

The soil inside the premises of the College gets parched due to the hot climate in Jaffna. The grounds need to be maintained well because it is used throughout the year for sporting activities. The installation of an irrigation system will help us to have a lush green ground throughout the year. Rs. 2,000,000 will be funded by the Government Grant from 'Gamperaliya' Rapid Rural Development Programme 2019 (RRDP). Rs. 500,000 will be funded by the College. This 2.5M project is in progress.

3. SANITARY FACILITY IMPROVEMENTS

Construction of additional toilets is very essential for the convenience of teachers and students. Rs. 1,000,000 will be funded by the Government Grant from 'Gamperaliya' Rapid Rural Development Programme 2019 (RRDP). This project is in progress.

4. REVERSE OSMOSIS PLANT

THE PINA organisation has installed an RO plant within the premises of St. John's College. The four taps on the Old Park Road is for the public and the four taps inside the College premises is for the staff and students of St. John's College. The opening ceremony was held on 14th March 2019.

5. SOLAR POWER PROJECT - PHASE 1

One of our distinguished old boys, Dr.Karunyan Arulanantham, donated Rs. 4M for the installation of Solar Power System to save electricity and to make St. John's environment-friendly. A 42.24KWP Tie Solar PV System has been installed. The opening ceremony was held on 13th February 2019

PRINCIPAL'S COMMENTS

I am glad to report that the College has implemented the policy of child protection put forward by the Diocese. We, as a community in Sri Lanka are slowly but surely changing course from using corporal punishment as a means of enforcing discipline. I am conscious of the fact that there are many who still confuse discipline with punishment and respect with fear. The community of St. John's needs all your support as we recognize the need for discipline whilst devising and learning new methodologies and creative ways of implementing discipline without resorting to any form of violence.

We have learnt in history that order brought out of violence and militarisation cannot be sustained. Such an effort will eventually lead to more violence and chaos. It is discipline due to respect and a sense of responsibility that is sustainable. It is this discipline that we must all endeavour to inculcate in our students – and in our community. However, this requires a lot of effort, hard work and patience.

As I interact with people, there is much said about the academic excellence that St. John's used to achieve in the past. The Northern Province, especially the peninsula, inherited the educational legacy due to the missionary schools. However, owing to the standardisation introduced by the government in the 70's, conflict, war and migration, the tables have, unfortunately, turned. Today, the Northern Province is struggling to keep pace with the other provinces in academic achievements at public examinations.

As an institution involved in education, and as being a part of a community that gives a lot of emphasis to academic excellence, we need to review our methods of teaching and learning as the facts and harsh reality of our descent are stubbornly glaring at us.

The tuition culture, exams based only on testing of memory without encouraging critical thinking or out of the box solutions and the yardstick of measuring the success of a school mostly by the number of students entering local universities, need to be re-evaluated. These cannot and must not be the only guiding principles.

What is education? We need to ask ourselves this imperative question. Are we, as educators, able to instil disciplines namely hard work, perseverance, eagerness to acquire knowledge & skills, in our students? Are we equipping our students to be responsible, skilled and mature human beings? In a commercial and corporate sense, are students passing out of St. John's College employable? In a community sense, are students passing out of St. John's able to contribute positively to the society?

I would like to quote from the meditation published by the Henri Nouwen Society on Tuesday 9th September on Education, as a reflection for all of us this morning

"The word school, which comes from schola (meaning "free time"), reminds us that schools were originally meant to interrupt a busy existence and create some space to contemplate the mysteries of life. Today they have become the arena for a hectic race to accomplish as much as possible, and to acquire in a short period the necessary things to survive the great battle of human life. Books written to be savoured slowly are read hastily to fulfil a requirement, paintings made to be seen with a contemplative eye are taken in as part of a necessary art appreciation course, and music composed to be enjoyed at leisure is listened to in order to identify a period or style."

As a school founded by missionaries, we have an obligation to inculcate a sense of social responsibility in our children. First, we must remember our obligations to God and fellow human beings. We must remember the missionaries who came to this island, giving up their comforts and securities. The one thing they had was the passion to serve God and human. We must remember with gratitude that they didn't have a sense of entitlement but a sense of service. I invite the community of St. John's to be led by their example.

Finally, as the Board of Governors are engaged in seeking a suitable person to the post of the Principal of St. John's College let us pray that God will guide them to select a candidate who will take this institution forward, to the future, not forgetting the legacy of St. John's College being a missionary school.
