St. John's Clinches Thrilling Victory in the 117th Battle of the North!

This historic big match, considered as one of the oldest and the most significant in the north, commenced on March 7th and was scheduled to continue until the 9th.

The first day of the Battle of the North started with a vibrant opening ceremony! Both Jaffna Central College (JCC) and St. John's College (SJC) displayed their spirit for the school with their anthems.





followed by the introductions of principals, officials, and teams. A commemorative group photo was captured before the fierce competition began. JCC won the toss and elected to bat first. Despite contributions from Rajithkumar Newton (24runs) and Sagathevan Sayanthan (55 runs), JCC was bowled out for 157 runs in 56.5 overs. St. John's bowlers shone brightly, with Arulseelan Kavishan claiming a stellar 5-wicket haul. Kugathas Mathulan ably supported him with 3 wickets. SJC's fielding prowess kept the runs in check, wrapping up the JCC innings before 3:00 PM.

St. John's College stepped into the field at 3:40 PM to chase down. They ended the day at a promising 109 runs for the loss of 2 wickets. Uthayanan Abijoyshanth(39runs), MahendranKinthushan (22runs), and Anderson Sachin Kanapath(36runs notout) provided a solid foundation for their innings .S.Thison and Sutharsan Anusanth from JCC managed to pick up a wicket each.





Day 2 of the 117th Battle of the North witnessed how St. John's College (SJC) consolidated their advantage. Resuming their 1st innings at 109/2, they added a crucial 119 runs before getting bowled out for a total of 228 runs in 70.4 overs. Nesakumar Ebenezer Jezial (52 runs) and Murfin Randyo (22 runs) played instrumental roles in building the score. Jaffna Central College's (JCC) bowlers fought back, with S. Thison and Thakuthash Abilash claiming impressive 4-wicket hauls each.





JCC needed a strong batting performance to stay in the contest. However, their 2nd innings faltered, managing only 140 runs before losing 9 wickets in 42 overs. St. John's bowlers continued their dominance, with a collective effort leading to 9 wickets captured. The 117th Battle of the concluded on Day 3. It began with Jaffna Central College resuming their 2nd innings. After a determined fight, they eventually bowled out for 149 runs in 57.1 overs. This set a target of just 79 runs for St. John's College (SJC) to win. SJC chased down the target comfortably, reaching 81 runs without losing a single wicket. Their openers displayed exceptional batting prowess, securing a dominant victory by 10 wickets.
